One of the benefits of being a locally owned and independently operated business (i.e. not being owned by a manufacturer) is that you get a huge range of technology to choose from and we are truly free to fit you with the most suitable technology to meet your particular individual needs and budget. Don't forget, hearing aid subsidies and ACC funding are available every six years, so if it's time to update your hearing aids, it's a great time to take advantage of these to assist the funding of your hearing aids. Audiologists are now able to lodge ACC claims directly for gradual occupational noise induced hearing loss, a process that you used to have to visit your GP for.

Technology update

Rechargeable technology continues to be very popular (where you charge the hearing aids themselves in a charger overnight and don't need to change hearing aid batteries). Some of these chargers also double as drying systems for your hearing devices. Hearing aids that use disposable batteries are also still widely available, however, as rechargeable aids are not suitable for everyone.





There has also been an interest in hearing aids that go 'in the ear' (rather than behind the ear) that are rechargeable. These are becoming increasingly available, but do not come in the very smallest sizes, and are convenient for some people who have had 'issues' with their hearing aids and glasses/masks etc behind their ears. As always, there are always pros and cons to each of the different models.
